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The T4T - Tools4Teaching in Digital Education

Settings project focuses on supporting adult educators and formal, non-formal and informal education providers to effectively transition to digital education and provide the same level of interaction and 'human-like' experience for learners as in the physical environment. The overall aim is to strengthen the capacity of adult educators and training professionals to build and maintain effective group dynamics in digital education environments to better engage their online learners.

Kick off Transnational Meeting in Reus, Spain

In February 2022, all partners met for the first time. The kick off took place at the premises of DomSpain, the project coordinator. VI One (Netherlands), MyArtist (Greece), EDUPRO (Lithuania) and ARTIED (Bulgaria) participated in person and SAN (Poland) online. Hybrid meetings can be challenging but fortunately all partners were able to overcome any problems and everything went smoothly.

As this was the first meeting, finances, management and the first steps to launch the project were discussed to ensure its success. To this end, DomSpain organised an 'open office' activity where all participants were divided into groups to discuss project management, quality assessment and dissemination. All in all, it was a fruitful meeting and all partners agreed that this was a crucial step to start the project on a good foot.

Second Transnational Meeting in The Hague, Netherlands

In September 2022, all partners participated in the second transnational meeting in person. It was hosted by the Dutch partner VI One Consultancy. During the meeting, the partners discussed the progress of the work on the project results and planned the next activities and implementation phases. The consortium discussed the final details of the guidelines, aimed at adult educators, on how to better design effective group dynamics in online learning environments. It was also summarised the process of creating the Resource Library, which brings together many useful tools, materials and European good practices for sustaining online group interaction.
